Norwegian Higher Education System

Types of institutions:

- Universities
- University colleges
- Specialised colleges

Degree structure:

- Bachelor's degree – 3 years
- Master's degree – 2 years
- PhD – normally 3 years
 - Some programmes last 5-6 years (e.g. integrated master's degree)

Around **150 programmes** are taught in English – visit StudyInNorway.no for a full list of English-taught programmes

Application Process

Admission requirements:

- **High school diploma** (or equivalent for Bachelor's)
- **Relevant undergraduate degree** (for Master's)
- **English proficiency** (or of a Scandinavian language if wanting to study in Norwegian)

- Application deadline: **April 15**
- [Samordnaopptak.no](https://www.samordnaopptak.no) is used for applications to public institutions

Housing Options

1. Student Housing

- Managed by student welfare organizations
- International students third prioritized group
- Usually one of the most affordable options 300 – 600 euros
- High competition

2. Private Rent

- Renting an apartment from a private landlord
- Price depends on location, but is usually expensive 1000 – 1500 euros

3. Shared Housing

- Renting accommodation with several people
- A room in a shared apartment
- The most common alternative 600 – 800 euros

Student Life

Academics:

- Emphasize independent study
- Expected to take responsibility for learning and managing time

Student Organizations and Social Life:

- Active unions that organize social events (prom, trips, quizzes etc.)
- Different student associations (sports, music, literature etc.)
- Gathering places in universities (bars)

Work-Life Balance:

- Common to have a part-time job

Living Costs:

- Estimated living cost 14 000kr (1200 euros)
- In most cases, Norwegian government do not offer scholarship for international students
- However, it is possible to find a part-time job
